News for Seniors

ACT FOR SENIORS: Seniors may wish to retake the ACT test this fall to improve their score. The next ACT test date is OCTOBER 25, 2008. How can you sign up?

⇒ Register online (www.actstudent.org) or mail in the registration folder by **September 19**. The fee is \$31 for ACT with NO Writing or \$46 for ACT Plus Writing.

If you wish to take the ACT free, you must:

- agree to retake the entire PSAT test again this fall. (ACT test on October 25 and the WorkKeys test on October 28.)
- submit an ACT voucher with the mail-in registration folder by September 19, 2008. You will be automatically signed up for the Work Keys Test (October 28) when you ask for the voucher.

All ACT registration materials are available in the Guidance Office in A Building.

SENIOR MEETINGS: The PSAT test scores should arrive in early fall. The counselors will then meet with all seniors to share and explain the test results.

Permission to Place ACT/SAT Test Scores on Transcript

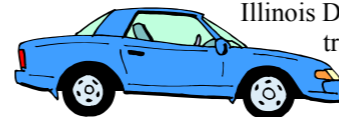
ACT and SAT test scores may not be placed on a student’s transcript unless the student and parent give written permission to the school. If the student/parent decide not to place scores on the transcript, it becomes the responsibility of the student to see that their scores are sent to the college(s) of their choice.

Seniors will be given a *Permission to Place Test Scores on Transcript* form by their counselor or they may pick one up in the Guidance Office. Parents are asked to sign the form and make sure their student returns it to the Guidance Office as soon as possible. This policy also includes scores from AP tests.

Scholarship Information

Be sure to check this newsletter each month for scholarship eligibility requirements and due dates. Scholarship information is also posted on the daily announcements and on a bulletin board in the Guidance Office. It is the student’s responsibility to pick up scholarship applications and turn in completed applications and any required materials by the deadline. Applications will be available in the Guidance Office and should be returned to the Guidance Office when completed.

Attention All Current High School Students: If you took a drivers education class through the Southern Illinois Driving School, you may request to have that class placed on your high school transcript. The class is worth 0.5 credit, and the grade that you received in that class would be computed into your accumulated grade point average.



This request must be signed by both the student and his/her parent. Please see your counselor for the necessary request form.

News for Juniors

PSAT TEST DATE: The PSAT test (Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test) will be given to interested juniors on Saturday, October 18, 2008. This is not a college entrance exam, however like the SAT, the PSAT has been redesigned to be more closely aligned with high school curricula and college skills. Taking this test is excellent preparation for those who want to take the SAT during the senior year of high school. See your counselor for sign-up information.

COLLEGE ENTRANCE EXAMS:

Most colleges and universities require an entrance exam; those most commonly required are the ACT and/or the SAT. Currently, both the SAT and the ACT tests include a writing component and/or subject area testing. Students need to check with the colleges/universities to determine which test is required, and if the writing or subject area element is also required for admission and placement. The cost will increase an additional \$14.50 - \$20 over the basic test fee.

PSAE: Juniors in Illinois will again be required to take the Prairie State Achievement Examination in April. The PSAE is a graduation requirement. It includes the ACT test as part of that exam; that score is accepted by colleges and universities for admission purposes. The Writing Assessment will be included this year.

ACT & SAT: It is recommended that students register for either test online; a credit card is required for all on-line registrations. It is still possible to register by mail. See your counselor for registration materials.

News for Sophomores & Freshmen

This year all freshmen and sophomore students will have access to two tests that are excellent career planning and test-taking opportunities. The **EXPLORE** test is designed for ninth graders and it will be given to our freshmen. The **PLAN** test is designed for tenth graders, and it will be given to our sophomores. Both tests will be administered this fall. There will be no cost to our students.

What's the benefit to the students?

- ◆ Both tests provide helpful career planning information.
- ◆ Both tests give information that can help students make sound course selections while in high school.
- ◆ Both tests allow students to become exposed to the kinds of test questions that are part of the 11th grade ACT test.
- ◆ Both tests will be given in a format similar to eventual ACT testing.

P.S. for Sophomores

Sophomores were assigned to either first or second semester Safety Education (Drivers Education) based on two eligibility requirements: 1) date of birth; 2) passing at least eight courses during the two semesters prior to taking Safety Ed. Students who failed to meet the eight-course requirement were placed in Safety Ed for second semester, allowing them time to pass the necessary course work.

P.S. for Freshmen

The Consumer Education Proficiency Test will be given to registered students early this fall. If a student passes this test, he or she is then allowed to drop Career Education, if currently enrolled, and take a study hall. If that student is enrolled in Career Education for second semester, he or she may drop that course and choose a different elective or take a study hall. No graduation credit is given for passing the test; however, the state requirement for passing consumer education is fulfilled. Students interested in signing up to take this test should do so in the Guidance Office. Sign up dates will be given during the daily announcements.

College Representative Visits—Updated

Throughout the school year, college representatives from a variety of public and private colleges and universities schedule time to visit MVTTHS to speak to interested students. Upcoming visits are posted on a bulletin board in the Guidance Office in A Building, they are listed on daily announcements, and will be a regular feature of *Guidance Gazette*. The representatives are on campus in the Career Center *after school*, and students may stop by to speak with them. The following schools will visit in September:
